SCHOOL WORKER UPDATE



RACHAEL writes.....

Edwinstree C of E Middle School, Buntingford:

In the send half of the spring term, I managed to deliver two Collective Worship (CoWo) sessions online- the first one about Lent and the second about Easter. I presented various clues as to why Christians believe that the resurrection is real and included a short video clip of Bear Grylls talking about his Christian Faith.

Now in the summer term, I have delivered more online Collective Worship sessions on the theme of Endurance. For one of them, I included the famous (and moving!) video clip of Derek Redmond's 200M race at the Barcelona Olympics in 1992 when his Dad helps him finish the race. It felt like a great analogy of how God the Father enables us to endure to the end!

Since half-term at the end of May, it has been a real joy to be able to return to the school in person! I have re-started the CoWo club on Monday lunchtimes. Six children signed up, but, so far, 3 new boys have attended for the first 3 weeks. They are keen to be involved and have contributed to the Collective Worship session I led on Monday 14th June. This half term's value is on Trust. Next week I lead the CoWo session again and each of the boys will be involved again.

After the lunchtime club (which finishes at 1pm) I sit in the staff room and work until the CoWo starts at 230pm. This has afforded opportunities to chat to a few members of staff. So far, no deep and meaningful conversations but I am grateful for the chance to start building relationships there.

King James Academy, Royston

I have continued my best to stay in regular communication with KJAR. I have not heard anything at all from them but I know that the Head is leaving soon and the executive head of the DLPT will be stepping in for a while. So I will keep contacting them from time to time and keep praying that I get results soon!

Other areas:

I have recently heard back from Joy at British Youth for Christ about their touring teams. At the moment they are only sending out their band, The Sense (<https://yfc.co.uk/thesense/>), but it looks like this is a great option for an event or week of events in schools. This

conversation is ongoing but I will be in touch with the Trustees about various aspects of this possibility.

Our financial position

I am pleased to report that the finances of the BRAVE Trust have continued in a healthy state. We finished 2020 with enough money in the bank to keep us running for a year or so, thanks to a few large grants and one-off donations in addition to the faithful regular support we receive. Whilst the Covid restrictions made life challenging in many ways, and continue to do so, they have had the side effect of reducing our outgoings! Looking to next year, assuming schools work reopens fully in person, we will be looking for new funding to avoid running at a deficit.
